YOUTH SERVICE REPORT 2017-2018

The year has been disappointing in the way that a number of students who had expressed interest in Rotary programs which our Club has supported in the past withdrew at the last minute. The Board had agreed to support a local candidate competing for a place at the National Youth Science Forum in Canberra in January, and to sponsor a young man to the Rotary Youth Leadership Assembly (RYLA) at Tyalgum in January. Support was offered to students supposedly keen to attend the Conocophillips Science Experience - September to December, the Honeywell Engineering Summer School in December, the Rotary Youth Transition Seminar in January and the Rotary Adventure in Citizenship in May. As the students withdrew we were thus unable to support them to attend these excellent programs as we would have liked to.

Lismore West did sponsor a young woman from elsewhere in District 9640, who could not otherwise have attended, to participate in RYLA in January and we were warmly thanked for that.

Our Club sponsored a team of three from Trinity Catholic College to compete at the District 9640 Model United Nations (MUNA) at Tweed Heads in March, representing Russia! They came second and one of their team, Danielle Hunter, was selected to compete in the Australia wide MUNA in Canberra in August.

Our Club sponsored, and transported, three local year 10 students, two from the Lismore High campus and one from Blue Hills College, to the Rotary Youth Program of Enrichment (RYPEN) held at PCYC Camp Bornhoffen in May. They were thrilled by the experience, as were their parents and the Blue Hills College principal, and are happy to come and talk to our Club about it. We also, at the request of District, paid for an orphan to attend this camp, cost for the four \$1180.

As well as these Rotary programs two of our members continued for half the year to attend Lismore Heights Primary School to listen to, and correct, student's reading. If any other members, or partners, would like to give some time to this activity it is both enjoyable and extremely welcomed by the school.

One of our members assisted the Police "Licensed to Drive" Program in January, much appreciated by the local police, and some members have expressed interest in assisting with the Youth Learner Driving Program to start in Lismore shortly, organized by HART Services.

I am to attend the Lismore High campus School Assembly in June to talk about Rotary Youth programs so, hopefully, we will have more student enthusiasm for a range of programs in 2018-19.

VOCATIONAL SERVICE REPORT 2017-2018

The vocational program for the year has been interesting and well supported by members and family. Visits included the new Rescue Helicopter Base, the Dunoon Men's Shed, the Wollongbar TAFE Restaurant, the Grow Centre for Mental Health, and the Wilson Park Special School.

The Rescue Helicopter has recently moved to a new, purpose built facility, co-located with the Lismore airport. The new facility was necessary to accommodate the new model helicopters now in use. Club members were given an extensive tour through the facility including the new helicopters. The capabilities of these aircraft were explained. It is very impressive and pleasing to have such capabilities and capacity in our regional area. The visit was rounded off with an excellent BBQ.

Our visit to the Dunoon Men's Shed was also very interesting. The "shed" has evolved over several years into a type of drop in centre where men from the local district gather to "make stuff" for their local community, and enjoy each other's company. The Shed has accumulated a wide variety of wood-working and metal bending equipment and draws on the skill of retired members to make and cross train others. Following the visit we retired to the nearby Dunoon Sports Club for dinner. Boys only for this visit!

Our regional TAFE at Wollongbar has a catering school with a fully set up "Nightcap Restaurant". Our club has supported this facility by holding an annual meeting in their trainee galley and restaurant. Students have to do everything. The starting point was to design the menu. 3 courses were selected, 3 choices per course with the appropriate balance between courses. Quantities of the different foods was then determined, costed and ordered. Menus were printed, wait staff and chef's spoke about the selections available, food prepared and served. All very impressive, intensive and, for us at least, very enjoyable. The students were all introduced to us and we showed our appreciation for their efforts.

We also showed our support for our Lismore Grow Centre for Mental Health by holding a meeting at their premises. Grow is an anonymous and free mental health support group that provides a well developed and proven support program for people with mental health problems thereby allowing individuals to address their problems without the stigma that often goes with mainstream treatments. Our club has helped GROW recover after the devastating 2017 flood and the facility now operates a small commercial kitchen and barista coffee cafe. For our visit, stall and supporters prepared an excellent pasta feast followed by sweets and coffee as their way of thanking us for our support. An appropriate donation was made and gratefully received.

The final visit on our vocational program was also an annual event, this time to the Wilson Park Special School. Our club has been supporting the school for many years with several large scale hands on building projects and other financial support. Each year we hold a meeting at the school and staff and friends cook up a mighty feast as their way of thanking us for our support. This year the Principal, Helen Rae prepared a short photo journey of our work together at the school and showcased some of the students and their wonderful personal achievements. A very humbling and uplifting night.

INTERNATIONAL REPORT 2017-2018

This year the Club continued to make worthwhile contributions to International Service with financial support for overseas projects.

The Rotary Foundation The Rotary Foundation's mission is to support the efforts of Rotary International to achieve world understanding and peace through international humanitarian, educational and cultural exchanges programs. The Foundation sets a target of US\$100 per member for Rotary Clubs. Once again this year our club and members will have exceeded this target by more than 50% with the donations we have made to Rotary's Centurion and other programs.

Sustainable Cambodia. Lismore West continued its sponsorship of two students in a primary school, members of the "Kangaroo Club". This sponsorship covers both their school fees and their living expenses at home. Two other children are sponsored by individual club members. It was very heartening to see a photograph of one of the children that was passed around at one of our meetings. A young child has prospered and was delightfully looking well on the way to being a 'young lady'. school.

Our International 'leaders' in Gainesville Florida are putting together a monumental project in Cambodia with substantial matching grants to take in a further 6 village communities in their 'Sustainable Cambodia' program. Your board in joint session with next years' directors has agreed in principle to support this effort. It will mean that families in 6 new communities will be empowered to create self-sustaining communities with clean water, an increasing supply of food, and other opportunities for self-reliance. Vegetables will be added to their main irrigation crops of rice and dried fish. The aim is to spread this model throughout the whole of Cambodia.

Hosting District 5510 from Arizona From the 1st to 4th November 2017 our club in unison with the Club of Summerland Sunrise hosted members from district 5510 in Arizona USA. The 'tourists' together with several members of Summerland Sunrise attended a combined meeting at the Lismore East Bowling Club on the 2nd November, which was a ladies evening for us. Our guests, amongst other activities, had trips to Prospector Falls and a macadamia farm. My sincere thanks to Ian and Carolyn Mulligan, Graham and Helen Hargreaves and Rod Fayle for hosting these visitors. My wife Megan and I on our recent trip to the USA stopped off at Phoenix Arizona and enjoyed an evening out with the couple that we were honoured to host.

Sister Club – Yamato Takada Some members from our sister club Yamato Takada are visiting Lismore in the latter part of this month as guests of the Lismore City as part of the Sister City Program. The program was organised by Lismore Council. Unfortunately and the short duration of the visit did not include a Thursday night so we have been disappointed at not having them to a 'ladies night'. We are still hopeful that some of our members may still have the opportunity to meet with them – even if it is only for an afternoon tea. At the time of writing this report this has not been finalised.

A visit by our club to Yamato Takada was originally planned to take place in March this year (in time for cherry blossom time) but there were not enough takers this time round. Wives and partners how about next year?

Sister Club – Cashmere NZ We continue to communicate with our sister club in Cashmere NZ. They are right in the heart of earthquake territory and they are very much in our thoughts. We continue to receive their weekly bulletin "Spoke" which our indefatigable secretary forwards with religious fervour. (Well done Graeme)

The maternity hospital in Fiji As was the case last year, with the able assistance of Trevor Hopf, the club has been able to assist the maternity hospital in Fiji with another \$500 to carry out some further needy repairs to their building. Our thanks to Trevor for overseeing this project.

Used Stamps for Rotary. Lismore West remains one of the Clubs still collecting these stamps and sending them to be sorted and sold by a dedicated member of the Rotary Club of Burleigh Heads and his wife. Over the years they have raised over \$50,000 which is given to Donations in Kind.

Overall I consider it has been a satisfactory year though the need is always so much greater than the resources that are available. I thank the members of Lismore West for their efforts that raised the money we were able to donate to the above areas of need.

To outgoing President Barry and the rest of my colleagues on his board - congratulations on a job well done. To incoming President Trevor Hopf and his board, I wish you the best for 2018-2019.
